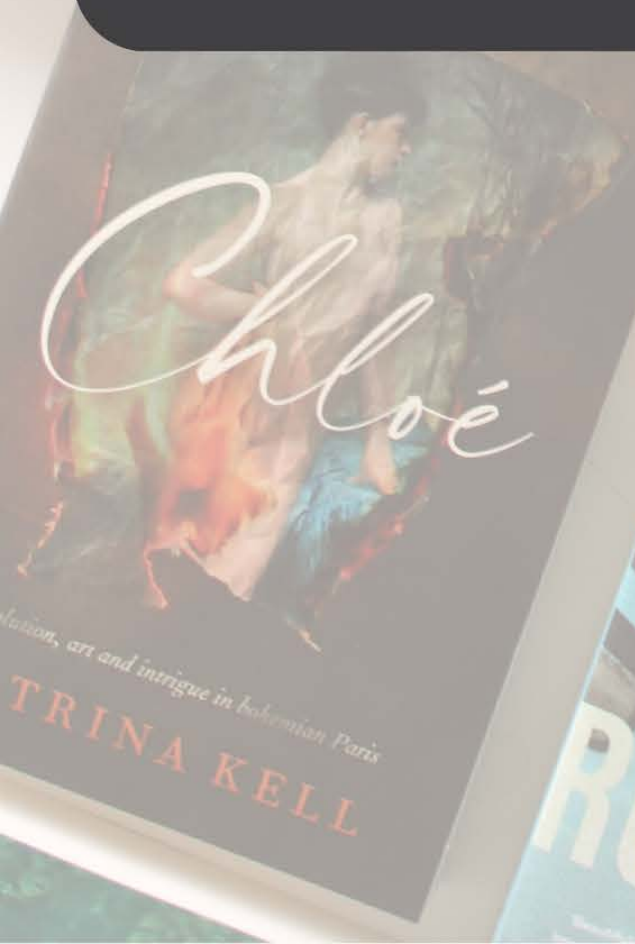

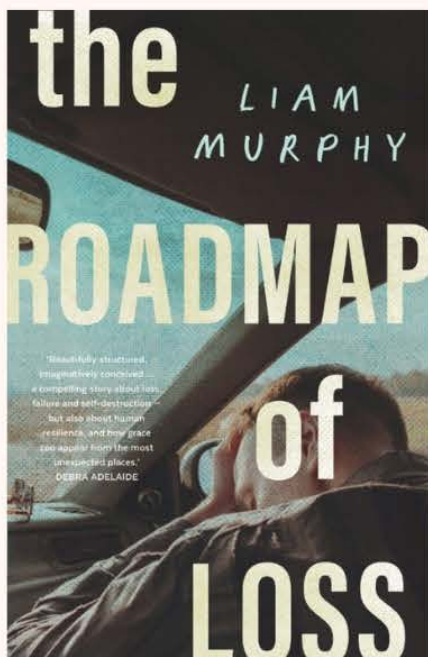

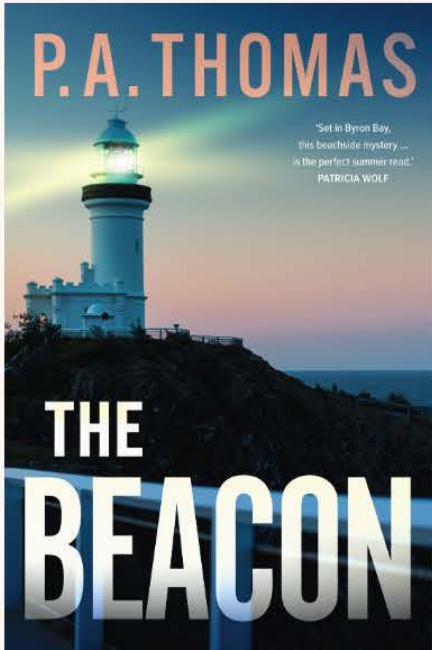
Faced with the enormity and polarity of late nineties America, Mark battles loneliness, addiction and nihilism in his search for answers.

But when rumours emerge that Patrick was about to publish an explosive article – its subject unknown – Jack begins to suspect his death is not what it seems.

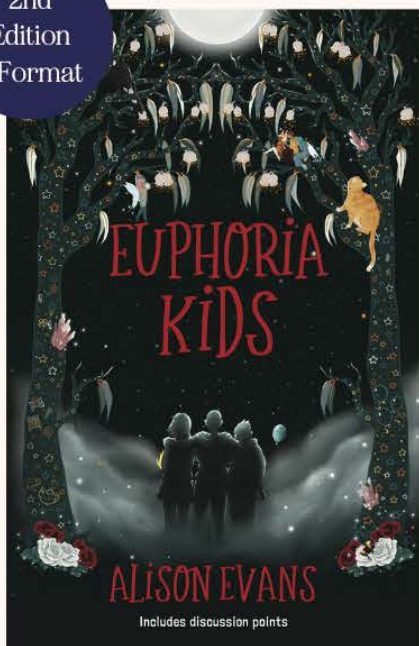

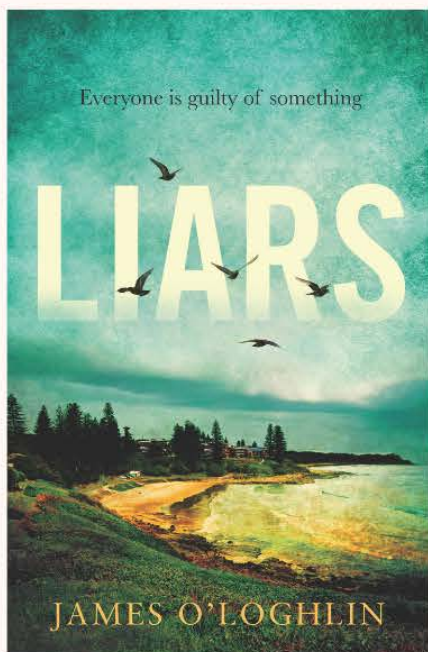
At present she contributes to *The Age* and the *Sydney Morning Herald*, writing features and a Saturday column, 'Turning Pages', about books and writing.
